 - c. We will follow Standard Four Instructional Planning and Strategies for teachers as it outlines the state requirements regarding the knowledge, disposition and purpose of instructional implementation in schools.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary school) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically these conferences will be held at the end of the first and second trimester.
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities.
